These 3 key parts of the preschool day are vital for consistency and teaching children what we DO want them to do, instead of correcting them for doing what we don't want them to do. We will talk about how to intentionally teach each of these 3 strategies and how to embed them into our everyday activities. We will also discuss how having these strategies in our classroom also reduces challenging behavior.

FLIP IT! is a strategy that offers a simple, kind, strength-based, common sense, and effective four step process to address children's day to day challenging behavior. In this 2-part training, teachers will learn the teaching methods to implement FLIP IT! in their classrooms. FLIP IT! isn't just for children with challenging behaviors, but for all children in the classroom to learn how to appropriately regulate their emotions. In addition to the workshop, follow-up TA will be provided to help you implement the strategy in your classroom. FLIP IT is beneficial for children birth-5 yrs. \*Participants must complete both sessions to receive credit. Cost: \$12

Using Visual Supports in the Classroom SE 6:30-8:00pm 1.5 cr. hr. N. Campisano Wed., Nov. 8

Children are often visual learners, and using this to your advantage can be a powerful tool in the classroom. In this workshop you will learn about the importance and impact of using visual supports, as well as practical tips on how and when to use them so that you can effectively implement them in your classroom. You will also have opportunities to collaborate with other teachers. This workshop is suitable for any level of experience using visual supports in the classroom.

**Rethinking Interactions** Thurs., Nov. 16

Interactions play a crucial role in teaching young children. In this workshop, we will discuss when interactions should be occurring, how quality interactions look, and the 'why' behind the importance of them. Participants will leave with helpful techniques to add to their tool kit.

It is no secret that mindfulness, yoga, and breathwork are known to have positive effects on the nervous system. But what does this have to do with your classroom? In this workshop, you will learn how these concepts support children's social-emotional development, and how to incorporate them into your classroom.

Family Partnerships

Children in our classrooms come with parents and families; this can sometimes be a challenge. This workshop will give educators concrete ideas for working with parents and families. Topics will include building relationships, strategies for on-going communication, and tips for handling difficult situations. **CPR & First Aid**

This training teaches early childhood educators and others how to respond to and manage illness and injuries in a child or infant during the first few minutes until professional help arrives. Class size is limited. Cost: \$40

Stay Healthy, Stay Clean: Diapering & Toileting **HS** 6:30-8:30pm 2.0 cr. hr. C. Demaree

This training will include a brief overview and demonstration of proper infant/toddler diapering and toileting according to state regulations and evidence-based practice. It will include best practices aimed at promoting sanitary practice and reducing risk of spreading bacteria, viruses, or various infectious diseases for diapering and toileting. Additionally, participants will learn how to navigate toileting practices for children with special health care needs or limited mobility.
